In general, the approach is to install the software, then license the software. The Product Disc Installation Assistant provides an easy way to accomplish these two tasks.

• In Windows, insert the CD or DVD - the AutoRun feature will load the Installation Assistant - you may Install a licensed product, Install other product demos, or view Release Information. If you have a Certificate of Authenticity, enter your License Key, Serial Number, and Name to Install and automatically License.

- If AutoRun is not enabled:
- In Windows, Click on the Start Button
- Select Run
- Select D:SETUP, or type D:SETUP (or E:SETUP if CD/DVD drive E:, etc.)
- Press (ENTER) or click on OK
- In Windows Vista, you may not have the Run Option select Computer, your CD/DVD drive, and open Setup
- Answer the questions and follow the instructions on your screen

Note: You may also Un-Install SmartClick by running SETUP.EXE After SmartClick has been properly installed. (SmartClick Setup will ask you if you wish to Un-Install.) This has been provided as a convenience to the user. It is recommended that you use the Control Panel | Add/Remove Programs Icon to remove SmartClick.

Start SmartClick

Click on the Start Button, and open the Start Menu.

Select (All) Programs, then Select SmartClick. The SmartClick menu will have selections corresponding to the icons in the group. Select SmartClick to begin operation.

The SmartClick palette will appear, and SmartClick will begin normal operation. If the mouse cursor is held steady (within the jitter distance limits), and automatic click will occur. Use the SmartClick palette to select other mouse, events, and actions. Use SmartClick Setup to modify the palette, change dwell settings, or configure other SmartClick options.

General Information

SmartClick allows a user to operate Windows and Windows applications entirely without the need to physically click on the buttons on your mouse, trackballs, and joysticks. Left clicks, right clicks, double clicks, drag and move, etc. are all possible with SmartClick. For detailed technical information, refer to the SmartClick Advanced Notes.

OK

The OK button accepts and saves all current settings.

Cancel

The Cancel button ignores all changes and does not save settings.

Help

The Help button opens the Contents of the SmartClick Help file.

SmartClick Welcome!

Welcome to SmartClick for Windows 2000 / XP / Vista / 7!

SmartClick provides automatic operation of clicks, drags, double-clicks, common keystrokes, and special actions all via a hover (or dwell) type interface. This enables a user that cannot click or trigger button presses to completely operate Windows just by pointing.

Enjoy!

What is SmartClick?

SmartClick enables all the functionality of an accomplished user with a normal mouse, but accessible entirely just by pointing! Double-clicks, right-clicks, drags, and keyboard options are just the beginning. Useful features such as Auto-Repeat (mouse clicks or up/down arrows), Close Window, and Escape key add even more capabilities. So if you can move the mouse cursor (whether by mouse, trackball, joystick, laser-eye tracker, or any other means), you can completely run & operate Windows quickly & easily!

SmartClick provides basic functions such as mouse clicks, drag functionality, and double-clicks, along with other useful actions and events to allow a user that cannot click or use buttons or switches a way to operate Windows. With SmartClick, Windows can be operated entirely from a pointing device - just by pointing! Utilizing the dwell concept (a hover and wait approach), a user can position the mouse cursor to a location, and then wait for the required dwell time delay (keeping the mouse pointer within the jitter distance area), and a mouse click (or any of the selected functions from the SmartClick palette) will occur. This creates a simple, yet powerful interface that allows any user to run Windows just by being able to move the mouse cursor.

Why do I need SmartClick?

If you can move a pointing device (it is easy to move the mouse cursor), but don't have the ability (or find it uncomfortable) to perform a clicking action; or can only operate one button; or cannot press and hold a button for click-and-drag; then SmartClick provides the tools and additional actions that can make operating and doing tasks in Windows simple and easy.

With SmartClick, if you can point and move the mouse cursor, then you can run Windows, and do common tasks, simply by pointing! All you need to do is select the action from the SmartClick palette, and use the automated dwell settings to trigger (perform) the action!

Starting SmartClick

Click on the Start Button, and open the Start Menu. Select (All) Programs, then Select SmartClick. The SmartClick menu will have selections corresponding to the icons in the group. Select SmartClick to begin operation.

SmartClick will start automatically the first time you load SmartClick. A standard/basic default palette will be displayed. Hover (dwell) for 2 seconds (default dwell time) will result in left-click at the mouse cursor location.

The following icons will also be available in the SmartClick group:

SmartClick - runs SmartClick!

SmartClick Setup - Configuration options

SmartClick Help - Help (this file)

Licensing Information - Displays current license status of SmartClick, allows instant licensing

Licensing Information

SmartClick uses the IMG License Manager to manage the licensed use of this product. If unlicensed, the product will run as demo (i.e. a demonstration version). In the demo (unlicensed) mode, SmartClick will run for about an hour, and then exit, displaying the license manager (announcing that it is unlicensed). You may restart SmartClick up to 100 times (the demonstration period limit). After the demonstration period is over, SmartClick will not operate unless it is licensed. For extended evaluation and testing purposes, please contact IMG Customer Service for an evaluation license. Once licensed, the operation will not be limited in any way.

The most common methods of licensing are electronic (web/e-mail based) and by certificate (Certificate of Authenticity). In both cases, there will be a registered serial number, and a license key made available once a license has been purchased - these need to be entered into the IMG License Manager to activate a valid license. For further details, refer to the IMG License Manager.

Note: There are numerous license schemes (including OEM, site, & enterprise licenses) available to meet the needs of all our customers. If you have any licensing questions, please contact Innovation Management Group, Inc. directly.

In order to License SmartClick, the correct License Key and Serial Number must be entered into the IMG License Manager, along with some text for the Customer (and optional Company) text areas. The License Key and Serial Number can be found on the Certificate of Authenticity, or in the Software Unlock Codes e-mail.

Options

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The View Current License File (LICENSE.LIC) button will load the file LICENSE.LIC from the installation folder. This file contains the actual license information for the product, or the license information used to validate a License Key and Serial Number.

Note: Because an Evaluation License uses this same file, the Delete (Reset) option should be used if Licensing the product after using an Evaluation License.

The Delete (Reset) License File (LICENSE.LIC) will remove the existing LICENSE.LIC, then copy the file LICENSE.ORG to LICENSE.LIC (both in the installation folder). The file LICENSE.ORG is the "as shipped" license file, and should be the License File when using a License Key and Serial Number to license the software.

Note: For License Purposes, using the Support Option to Delete (Reset) the License File is essentially the same as un-installing, then re-installing the software. Because this option is quicker and simpler, it is the preferred approach to resolve any license issues. Note that manually copying the file LICENSE.ORG to LICENSE.LIC (in the installation folder) performs the same operation as this option.

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Note: For Retrieved Licenses (via Retrieve Purchased License, and via the Retrieve License Support Option), License Key and Serial Number information is processed exactly as if this information was directly entered in the Authentication area. Therefore, all issues that may affect licensing also apply to these automated options (e.g. License File status, User permissions, etc.)

To run SmartClick Setup:

Open the Start Menu, Select (All) Programs, Select SmartClick, then select the SmartClick Setup icon in the SmartClick Program Group Menu.

OR

From SmartClick, click the SmartClick icon on the task bar to open the menu, and click SmartClick Setup.

If SmartClick is running while you are selecting options from the following setup screens it will change to the new settings immediately after you click OK to save the changes.

You do not need to restart SmartClick to configure it with the new settings. On each screen you may also choose to click Cancel to exit without saving the new settings.

SmartClick Operation Notes

SmartClick is designed to operate seamlessly with Windows. However, due to limitations in the various releases of Windows by Microsoft, the following notes identify some issues that may affect operation. It may be worthwhile to verify you are on the most recent service pack for your current version of Windows.

Basic Operation

When Active, SmartClick will perform a mouse left-click after the dwell time expires (dwell time settable in SmartClick preferences). You must move the mouse outside of the Jitter distance (also in SmartClick preferences) to reset the timer. To select double-click, drag, or other options hover over the SmartClick palette icon, and the item will be highlighted once selected. Now move to the location you wish to perform the operation (e.g. double-click), and hover until the dwell time expires - the selected action will occur at the new location. The palette icons, layout, colors, configuration, etc. may all be set within SmartClick preferences.

Desktop

Taskbar - it is highly recommended that the Auto-Hide option be turned Off on the Taskbar (Taskbar Properties / Taskbar & Start Menu Settings.

SmartClick Options (Icon on Taskbar)

You can quickly get at the following options by clicking on the SmartClick Icon: SmartClick Visible, SmartClick Active, SmartClick Preferences, Direct Select Menu, Display Info Window, and Single Action Only.

Dwell Clicking

Active - Dwell clicking is active, and all the palette buttons are visible and functional. Idle - Dwell clicking is inactive, and only the Move and Active/Idle buttons are visible.

Here you also have the option of setting how SmartClick will open (Active or Idle). Checking the option On will force SmartClick to open in Active. Remember that SmartClick will always open in whatever state it was in when it is closed (or Windows is Shut Down).

NOTE: During an Idle state, the dwell clicking feature will not function anywhere else on the screen, but it will still be functional only over the SmartClick Palette buttonsSmartClick_Buttons.

Set On/Off Key

The SmartClick On/Off key is used to toggle the SmartClick Palette from a visible mode, to a hidden mode while SmartClick is running within Windows. Within Setup, you may select the On/Off Key (or combination of keys) used to Show/Hide SmartClick. You may use keys F1 through F12, 0 through 9, and A through Z, by themselves, or in any combination with Ctrl, Shift, and/or Alt. Make sure SmartClick is not running when you select the On/Off Key.

The Activation key is used to toggle SmartClick from an active mode (awake), to an inactive mode (sleeping) while SmartClick is running within Windows. Within Setup, you may select the Activation Key (or combination of keys) used to Activate/De-Activate SmartClick. You may use keys F1 through F12, 0 through 9, and A through Z, by themselves, or in any combination with Ctrl, Shift, and/or Alt. Make sure SmartClick is not running when you select the Activation Key.

Single Clicker

Single Clicker

When selected On, this enables special handling of double-clicks, drags, right-clicks, etc., so a user that can single click (but not double-click or right click) can access SmartClick options. For example, with SingleClicker On, to double click, point to the Double-Click icon on SmartClick and Click, then point to the icon on screen, and Click. A Double-Click will be generated by SmartClick. This option disables the normal dwell (point & hover) approach used by SmartClick.

Release Required

Release Required

When selected On, this will require the release of the Mouse Button to begin the SmartClick action.

Important: No SmartClick action will occur until the Button or Key is released. The Single Clicker option must be turned On to enable the Release Required option.

TouchScreen (No Real Button Clicks)

TouchScreen (No Real Button Clicks)

The Touchscreen option changes the way SmartClick handles positioning & operation. In general, during Touchscreen operation, the mouse pointer doesn't move from one location to another the way a physical mouse does - it jumps from touched location to touched location. When operating in this way, SmartClick prevents the mouse click that would result from a touchscreen touch (normal touchscreen operation), and allows a touchscreen user to operate with SmartClick.

Play Sounds

Play Sounds

This turns on/off the system sound that SmartClick generates upon clicks.

IMPORTANT NOTE: If Sound is On while using SmartClick, it may affect other sound events in the system - Windows Event sounds (Program open/close, Menu selections, etc.), Text-To-Speech, etc.

Quiet Sounds

Quiet Sounds

When selected On, the softer (quieter) version of the mouse click sounds will be played by SmartClick.

Important: The Play Sounds option must be turned On to enable the Quiet Sounds option.

Drag Prompts

Drag Prompts

This turns on/off the sound that SmartClick generates during Drag mode. When selected On, SmartClick will generate a prompting sound to choose a beginning point, and a destination point to drag your cursor.

Important: The Play Sounds option must be turned On to enable the Drag Prompts option.

Info Window

Info Window

When selected On, an information window showing the dwell countdown timer (in seconds) and the current clicking mode selected will follow your windows pointer.

Configure System



There are 3 options available: SmartClick Icon on Desktop, Add SmartClick to Startup Group, and SmartClick Available at Logon (Vista only)

SmartClick Icon on Desktop

When selected, this option will display an icon on the Desktop. This is the "All Users" Desktop, so it will be available for all users. You may need correct permissions to apply this, if user is a limited user.

Add SmartClick to Startup Group

When selected, this option will add a shortcut to SmartClick in the Startup Group (Start Menu | Programs | Startup). This is the "All Users" Startup Group, so SmartClick will startup automatically for users. You may need correct permissions to apply this, if user is a limited user.

SmartClick Available at Logon

When available, this option will run SmartClick at logon (if logon screen in use), and also make SmartClick available for use in secure situations (Administration dialogs) when User Account Control is enabled. To apply this setting, Administration permissions are required, so if user is a limited user and User Account Control is enabled, an dialog requiring permission will be shown, and proper credentials are required to apply this setting.

Dwell Time

Dwell Time

This is the number of seconds the Windows pointer has to dwell over an area before a SmartClick action occurs. The dwell timer will start to countdown to 0, if the Windows pointer has stopped movement over an area of the screen. If the Windows pointer moves before the dwell countdown timer reaches to 0, the dwell countdown timer will reset back to its dwell time setting and no SmartClick action occurs.

Move the slider to the left to decrease the dwell time wait, and move the slider to the right to increase the dwell time wait.

Hover over the white circle to test with the current dwell setting to verify the current dwell time.

Jitter Distance

Jitter Distance

Jitter distance is used to compensate for slight movements by the Windows pointer when dwelling over an area of the screen. The dwell timer will not reset as long as the Windows pointer stays inside the jitter distance radius.

Move the slider to the left to decrease the jitter distance radius, and move the slider to the right to increase the jitter distance radius.

When Auto-Repeat is Enabled, Automatic Mouse-Clicks or Down/Up Arrow keystrokes will be sent to whatever application you're in, the frequency of the mouse clicks or keystrokes depends on the value of the Dwell Time. This is ideal for reading text, scrolling documents & browsing on-line information.

These options are available when Auto-Repeat is enabled.

Keys (Down / Up Arrow) - When Auto-Repeat is enabled, using this option will allow you to send the Down/Up Arrow keystrokes will be sent to your application. SmartClick Advanced Notes

IMPORTANT: These notes are intended for the extremely advanced and technical user and/or System Administrator. There is absolutely no need for the end-user of SmartClick to read these notes.

The mouse input control & hardware event generation is handled by the same technology that runs SmartClick's My-T-Soft family (including OnScreen My-T-Touch, My-T-Pen, and the original on-screen keyboard for windows, My-T-Mouse), Joystick-To-Mouse, Macrobat, and RJ Cooper's CrossScanner.

The SmartClick palette is a topmost window, and should operate as intended with all normal windows applications. The SmartClick palette may go behind other topmost windows such as OnScreen, or other on-screen windows. If necessary, position the SmartClick palette in such a way that any conflict is minimized.

For trainers and general users, the SmartClick palette may be clicked on and operate with single mouse left clicks (in addition to the dwell capability). By clicking on borders (non-icon areas), SmartClick can be moved (in addition to the move icon).

Swapping mouse buttons in the Window Control Panel will not greatly affect SmartClick. Left clicks mean the main mouse button, and right-clicks means the secondary, or context selection mouse button.

Settings (INI File / Registry Notes)

The following logic is used to manage SmartClick settings:

The initial defaults are in the SMARTCLK.INI file.

SmartClick can run exclusively from the INI file. This is accomplished by setting the DoNotUseRegistry=1 in the [Settings] section. This approach will use the SMARTCLK.INI file to hold all settings & configuration information. This approach means that every user of SmartClick on the machine SmartClick is installed on will have the same settings.

SmartClick can use the registry to hold different settings for different users. If DoNotUseRegistry=0 in the SMARTCLK.INI file, then the INI file will be used to establish the initial defaults, but from then on settings will be saved in the registry under the current user (e.g. HKEY_CURRENT_USER\SOFTWARE\Innovation Management Group, Inc.\SmartClick). This approach means that different users on the same machine can have customized settings.

The following documents the entries in the registry / INI file. The section (e.g. square-brackets heading) corresponds to a sub-key in the registry.

Version=1.50

Registry Only, used to track version of software installed - if this is different than the current running version, an automatic update will occur based on the current release.

[Settings]

DoNotUseRegistry=0

INI file only. If DoNotUseRegistry=1, then all settings will be saved in the INI file. If DoNotUseRegistry=0, then the INI settings will be used only as the original default settings to establish the current users original settings.

DisplayWindow=0
```

This is used to track whether the Info file (countdown display window) is visible. 1 is Yes, 0 is No.

DragPrompts=1

Sound setting. If DragPrompts=1, then spoken drag prompts are played during the drag sequence. Set DragPrompts=0 to bypass these.

```
DwellTime=1500
```

This is the dwell time in milliseconds, e.g. hover time to wait within Jitter distance prior to a click event. 1000 is 1 second.

Jitter=10

This is the distance in pixels

MenuCount=40

This is an internal setting for delays while the SmartClick menu is visible. A larger number means a longer delay.

Mode=16777217

This is an internal setting used to track SmartClick's status, and visible icons. It should not be modified.

PlaySounds=1

If PlaySounds=1, then click & double-click sounds will be played at each SmartClick event

QuietSounds=1

This is available if PlaySounds=1. When QuietSounds=1, a softer, quieter sound will be played for clicks and double-clicks.

ReleaseRequired=0

This is available only if SingleClicker=1. By default, SingleClicker actions will occur on the down button event. If ReleaseRequired=1, then the SingleClicker action will require the down, then up button events.

SingleClicker=0

If SingleClicker=1, then the SingleClicker mode is in use. This bypasses the hover/dwell wait time for event, and expects the user to perform a single click to activate the SmartClick action. Primarily used when a user can single click, but can't double-click or right-click. TouchScreen and SingleClicker are mutually exclusive, and TouchScreen should be 0 if SingleClicker=1.

SingleOnly=0

This is a setting (only available in menu from tray icon) that when enabled, performs the SmartClick action, then goes into an idle state. Due to changes in SmartClick's operation, it is not supported, and may not be fully functional. It is an obsolete setting, it should not be modified.

StartCount=30

This is an internal setting for delays - it is overridden internally based on the dwell setting. It is an obsolete setting, it should not be modified.

TouchScreen=0

If TouchScreen=1, then the touchscreen mode is in use. TouchScreen and SingleClicker are mutually exclusive, and SingleClicker should be 0 if TouchScreen=1.

Palette Icon Notes:

For entries in the palette that are actual Palette Icons to display, the actual value is used to indicate the order. Left most/top most is 1, next is 2, third is 4, fourth is 8, etc. Internally a 32 bit value is used to track modes & the order of the icons, so a value as a power of 2 is required.

ColorRef Notes

ColorRef entries are 0x00BBGGRR entries in Hex, where BB is Blue entries, GG is Green entries, and RR is Red entries. For example, 0x00FFFFFF is white.

If BumpFlip=1, then the automatic switching of orientation is enabled, and an automatic switch in orientation will occur when pushed onto the opposite screen edge, e.g. if horizontal, you will flip to vertical when the left or right side of the screen is bumped.

ButtonBorder=2

This is the border between the buttons and the palette edge in pixels.

ButtonColor=65535

This is the color of the button background. It is a ColorRef entry, displayed in decimal.

ButtonHeight=32

This is the button height in pixels.

ButtonSpacing=4

This is the pixel spacing between buttons on the palette

ButtonWidth=32

This is the button width in pixels.

ChordClick=0

This is the palette icon Left-Right chord click

CloseWindow=16

This is the palette icon close active window

Control=0 This is the palette icon Control key DoubleClick=1 This is the palette icon DoubleClick Drag=2 This is the palette icon Drag EscapeKey=0 This is the palette icon for the Escape key HidePalette=0 This is the palette icon for Hide Palette ImageDisplay=1 This setting indicates whether there is an image (palette icon) displayed on the palette for the corresponding palette icon. SnapToEdge=1

If SnapToEdge=1, then when SmartClick is within SnapToEdgePixels of an edge, SmartClick will "attract" to the edge.

This is number of pixels the SmartClick palette must be from a screen edge in order to "snap" to the edge.

TextColor=0

This is the color of the text on the palette. It is a ColorRef entry, displayed in decimal.

TextDisplay=1

If TextDisplay=1, then the text is visible on the palette. If TextDisplay=0, then no text is used, only the image.

Vertical=0

This indicates the orientation of the palette. Vertical=0 means the palette is horizontal, and Vertical=1 means the palette is vertical.

WheelDown=0

WheelUp=0

X1Click=0

X2Click=0

These entries are reserved for additional palette icons, not used.

[Keyboard]

ActivationKey=Ctrl-A

This is the setting for the keyboard control (e.g. Ctrl-Down A Ctrl-Up) used to toggle the active/idle state of SmartClick.

OnOffKey=Ctrl-S

This is the setting for the keyboard control (e.g. Ctrl-Down S Ctrl-Up) used to toggle the visible/not visible state of SmartClick.

[Display]

DisplayChangeEnabled=2

The DisplayChangeEnabled is a setting to handle changes in resolution when SmartClick is running. DisplayChangeEnabled=0 means that no SmartClick action is taken. DisplayChangeEnabled=1 means that a basic approach is used to handle changes, and DisplayChangeEnabled=2 means a "smart" algorithm is used to handle repositioning.
